<b>s106</b>	Section 106 agreement. Section 106 (s106) of the Town and Country Planning Act (1990) allows a local authority to enter into a legally-binding agreement or planning obligation with a landowner in association with the granting of planning permission.
<b>s278</b>	Section 278 agreement. Section 278 (s278) of the Highways Act (1980) is used where works are to be carried out on the existing adopted highway. Examples include the construction of new access/junction alterations, traffic calming or improved facilities for pedestrians and cyclists. The County Council may provide works at the developer's expense, or allow the developer to provide the works directly subject to approval.
